On Wednesday Miriam posted on her Facebook. "Thanks so much for all your prayers – Phoebe had an appointment with the consultant this morning and the echo of her heart shows that the clot has very nearly gone. (I couldn't quite believe my eyes even checked with the sonographer she was definitely looking at her left ventricle.)"

Phoebe will have to stay on blood thinners up to the time when she has an operation to replace her pacemaker. The consultant believes the pacemaker is causing the heart failure. After the operation she will have to stay on a cocktail of drugs. Phoebe was due to start in reception at her local school which can't happen but Miriam is hoping that a gentle start around Christmas may be possible.

Coffee and Chat

Have recently donated £300 to the Leprosy Mission.

The Leprosy Mission is an international Christian charity with **141 years** of experience. Through The Leprosy Mission's global family we serve a population of **305 million people** in around **30 leprosy-affected countries**. Leprosy is a mildly infectious disease associated with poverty. It is easily cured. Leprosy starts by damaging the small nerves on the skin's surface resulting in a loss of sensation. Without the gift of pain, everyday activities are fraught with danger. Unnoticed burns and ulcers can lead to permanent disability. Due to the inability to detect grit in the eye, blindness is a common consequence of leprosy.

According to the latest World Health Organisation statistics, there were 214,783 new cases of leprosy diagnosed globally in 2016 – around one every two minutes. More than 60 per cent of these new diagnoses were in India, due to the reluctance of leprosy patients to seek treatment because of the stigma surrounding the disease. The Leprosy Mission regard these figures as understated.
