

Virtual Prayer Room

On Friday 28th September Victoria thanked everyone for their prayers as her brother-in-law Mark was given the good news that the levels in his transplanted kidney were getting close to normal. She asked for prayers for her niece Phoebe who has been waiting for a lifesaving heart operation since August. Her sister-in-law Miriam said "Phoebe is losing weight and is vomiting due to her medication but she never really complains and keeps smiling." Miriam is bugging the hospital constantly but her appointment isn't until October 17th. Victoria says "They are all understandably shattered and extremely stressed" and went on "Miriam said that they really need a miracle and for someone to wake them up from this horrible dream."

On Saturday Doreen asked that people would continue to pray for Harry. She said "His mum Melanie is exhausted and Harry is finding the treatment hard and doesn't want to get out of the car when they reach the hospital."

On the same day an update from Barbara said "Anne Marie has given birth to a little boy weighing 8lbs but she cannot start treatment for the brain tumour until she gets a little stronger."

On Wednesday Victoria thanked everyone for praying for Phoebe. After waiting so long Paul and Miriam had had a call from the cardiac nurse on Tuesday saying that there had been a cancellation and they could see Phoebe. They were going to have a meeting with a surgeon the following day and the hospital would try and fast track everything and they should be prepared for a phone call at any time.

Miriam said "They will have to cut through her ribs and tummy again to attach new wires to her heart. She already has lots of scar tissue from her previous heart operations. The operation will take 5–6 hours and we expect her to be in intensive care for a time if everything goes smoothly." She went on "It is a pretty scary place at the moment but she is always teaching us how to be brave."

Also on Wednesday Jerry requested prayers for Stacey, Amy's friend who comes to church. She was involved in a nasty car accident the previous Wednesday and is currently receiving treatment in hospital for broken ribs and a punctured lung. She is stable and responding to treatment but not well enough to come home as her oxygen levels are low.



Science and God

Francis S. Collins (born in April 1950,) is the director of the Human Genome Project, the world's largest collaborative biological project, and is a scientist and believer who finds no conflict between those worlds. However, the former atheist didn't always embrace these perspectives. It wasn't until he went to medical school and encountered life and death issues at the bedside of his patients where he was constantly challenged with the question "What do you believe, doctor?" that he began searching for those answers. Through that journey, he found Jesus Christ. Collins has led a consortium of scientists to read out the 3.1 billion letters of the human genome, our own DNA instruction book. As a believer, Collins said he sees DNA as "the information of all living things, as God's language, and the elegance and complexity of our own bodies and the rest of nature as a reflection of God's plan."

The way to find out answers to big questions is "almost accidentally" In another interview when asked if he was an atheist he said "There is naivety in just saying there's no God. Science does not rule out the existence of a creator by definition because we don't know how the universe began, full stop."
