

By Wednesday Phoebe, who has Down's Syndrome, started to recover. Miriam said that Phoebe had told her "I a brave banana." Miriam thanked everyone for their prayers and support.

On Tuesday Ruth Hayward asked for prayers as they were still struggling to be re housed. Their current accommodation is totally unsuitable for Ruth in her present situation. They are also fighting hard to get Sammy into the right school. She said "We are really struggling at the moment."

On Wednesday Jerry requested prayers for Jan and Elspeth as they followed up the prayer cards.

Wednesday saw prayer sought for Fran, Maggie and her friend Sue who had started the pilgrimage walk Camino de Santiago. Maggie was starting further down the walk where she finished last year. Fran, who is walking alone with 6 kilos in her rucksack, started in France and had to cross the Pyrenees into Spain. She is hoping to walk 100miles in 14 days. On the first day she said "I trained quite hard for this but the track was really steep I was taking 6 steps forward and had to stop. For a time I thought I wasn't going to make it, I prayed to Jesus to give me a shove to the top and he did."

On Thursday Jerry asked for prayers for Sheena who was having an operation that morning. "Please pray for a positive outcome" he asked. Alan posted later that all had gone well and she was making good progress and sounds cheerful and asked for prayers for Sheena's full recovery.

## Talking Jesus How God Saved Two People

Kari Lynn Buchan wrote: I grew up in an abusive home. My mother was emotionally and verbally abusive to me my entire life. My relationship with God was also full of shame. I didn't think I was worthy of his love. But when I left home my relationship with God started to change. I started to realise I didn't need to earn His love; I began to pray for my mum and her salvation. Every time we'd chat on the phone, I'd ask her if I could pray for her. After several years of this she finally confided that she felt lost and lonely and in need of God. We prayed together and she accepted Jesus's love and asked for forgiveness for all her abuse towards me. Jesus rescued my abuser and I got to be there to witness her redemption. No one is too far gone. No one is out of reach of the Good News of Jesus.

The next session of Talking Jesus is this Wednesday starting at 7.30pm in the Stables. The first session of Talking Jesus was a huge success with around twenty people attending. The session was brilliantly led by Diana Gordon and included on screen inspirational real life scenarios of the difficulty of talking about Jesus at times. The short films led to a discussion about Talking Jesus and supported by a brilliant booklet with down to earth information.
