A new regular column on Church Finance. We start with figures that show our average weekly receipts (of money not earmarked for a particular purpose) and how that is spent. For the 12 months ending 30 September 2018.

Above figures showed that ignoring money given for special purposes, such as the Building or Mission Funds on average over the last 12 months we have been spending £471.17 more each week than we receive from all sources.

Obviously, that sounds bad but the situation has improved since the Deacon's letter to members earlier this year, had the figures for the last quarter only been given it would have shown that we were only spending £157.21 more each week than we receive. However, that quarter covers the summer months when we have fewer large bills. That is why to get a fair picture of our financial position it is important look at changing 12 month averages. If you would like more details ask Greg. On a positive note the Church received a £5,000 legacy in October.
