This week we update the figures given in our first column on 4th November- the figures that show our average weekly receipts (of money not earmarked for a particular purpose) and how that is spent. If you compare these figures with last month's you will see a significant increase in "Other donations". This is accounted for by the legacy money that was received in October. The legacy seems much smaller when shown spread over a year as a weekly average, but it does allow us to say that we are only spending £306 each week more than we receive, whereas for the 12 months to the end of September the figure was £460. In short, we still have some way to go before our future is secure.
