Money Bags the Regular Column on Church Finance

Questions have been asked about the "Activities for Generating Funds" figure given last week. This has two components, "Use of Premises" and "Special Events". Set against the second figure is "Cost of Generating Funds".

Most of the Special Events over the last 12 months raised money towards the Building Fund. Those that were applied to the General Fund, included in the figures last week were the Yuletide Street Fayre, Fringe Festival Refreshments, the Vintage Sale and the All About Gospel concert they together raised £899.08 or an average of £17.29 per week

Normally, fund raising costs are paid out of the proceeds of an event before any profit is passed to the church when no indication of what those costs may have been is provided.

"Use of Premises" is the money we receive as rents. The following have made payments. Namely: 1st Stalham Rainbows, Coffee & Chat, the Community Gym, the Lunch Club, MP Surgeries, R.A.F.A, Stalham & District Horticultural Society, our Table Tennis Group and Weight Watchers in the last 12 months

The Food Bank and Citizens Advice Bureau are regarded as a SBC support activity.

The cost of most church activities comes from our general funds.
