On Sunday 2nd Jane asked for prayers for Stewart and Linda's niece Helen who was poorly in hospital. On Monday Jane posted please continue to pray as Helen is unconscious. As the week progressed so has Helen, please keep praying for her.

Victoria updated the prayer room on Poppy's situation saying "Poppy's foot is healing nicely so no longer needs check-ups unless pain returns or her nephrotic syndrome (NS) relapses, meaning she would be back on the steroids, which caused the bone to die in the first place.

Her last 2 hospital check-ups for her NS found high amounts of protein in her urine so she must be leaking inconsistently as home tests have been negative. Positively she is very well at the moment with no swelling etc and hasn't relapsed since May. However, blood tests show that the level of the new drug in her body is higher than they would like so in the long term it needs to be reduced to avoid it becoming toxic to her body.

Prayers that she can continue to avoid all the bugs etc that come this time of year would be greatly appreciated as these may cause a relapse. Thank you." On Wednesday Jenny asked for prayers for her neighbour Nancie who was having severe back pain and X-rays showed she has several crumbling vertebrae and possibly osteoporosis.

Jerry sought prayers for Elspeth and Janet as they followed up the prayer cards. Prayers were also said for Rita who was scheduled for a hip operation on the same day. Please continue to pray for those in need of support, prayers are always greatly appreciated.
