Charles Darwin wrote. "If the misery of the poor be caused not by the laws of nature, but by our institutions, great is our sin." The fact that poverty is still rife 182 years on from Oliver Twist could and should be considered a sin.

Norwich Communities Homeless Welfare Appeal

Norwich Central Baptist Church (NCBC) and The Church of England will be opening through to the end of March to help the homeless. They are desperate for items such as:

Blankets, Sleeping Bags, Pillows, Cases, Rucksacks, Coats, Inflatable beds, (NEW Socks/Underwear, Thermal Inner Soles) Jumpers, and Heat Pads.



They are also desperate for volunteers. There are round the clock shifts and training will be given at NCBC prior to starting. Volunteers will need to have been vetted DBS or if not go through the Disclosure and Barring Service checks as they will be building relationships with vulnerable people For

Homelessness Guardian 22nd November 2018

At least 320,000 people are homeless in Britain, according to research by the housing charity Shelter.

This amounts to a year-on-year increase of 13,000, a 4% rise, despite government pledges to tackle the crisis. The estimate suggests that nationally one in 200 people are homeless.

Shelter says its figures, which include rough sleepers and people in temporary accommodation, are likely to be an underestimate of the problem as they do not capture people who experience "hidden" homelessness, such as sofa-surfers, and others living insecurely in sheds or cars, for example.
