Yesterday at the school disco she fell asleep on my lap and had developed a high temperature. I managed to get an out of hours appointment. This is the first high temperature she has had since starting her new treatment. We saw the most loveliest nurse practitioner ever. The way she was with Poppy was so kind and caring, she went the extra mile with the way she spoke and cared for her. Poppy has a chest infection so has antibiotics. Praying she stays in remission and this doesn't cause a relapse. Genuine kindness, care and understanding of your child's situation makes such a difference. In the pharmacy the lady on the till saw I had got a drink/crisps for Poppy and was going to pay by card. She said "You have to spend £5 to pay by card but don't worry I will still do it she looks like she needs a treat. Another act of kindness we were blessed to receive today. Poppy has blood tests this week followed by a check up the week after please pray that the results show she is stable. Forever grateful for the NHS and the wonderful care Poppy receives.

On Monday prayers were sought for Maureen Booth who had suffered a dislocation of her hip. On Tuesday David and Eileen posted "Good news Maureen's dislocation has been put right and she is home."
