TWAM is a Christian charity sending tools across the world based in Ipswich. Their mission is to collect unwanted tools, refurbish them, sort them into trade kits and send them across the world for livelihood creation. They send around 20 containers filled with over 300 tonnes of tools every year. They motivation is to be a refuge for the poor, a safe place to find support, hope and dignity through the provision of tools and equipment. TWAM are always looking for:

Agricultural tools: Builders' tools: Carpenters' tools: Electricians' tools Motor mechanics' tools: Plumbers' tools: Garage workshop: Sewing machines: manual, electric and treadle Knitting machines: machine

wool and needles Haberdashery: needles, cottons, large material pieces/rolls, buttons, zips etc Fully working IT equipment: Desktop computers and laptops running a minimum of Windows Vista, tablets, networking switch routers and cables.
