As part of our weekly worship we have a Prayer Team available to anyone who would like the support of others in prayer. You can find today's prayer team Sheena and Barbara in the prayer tent at the back of the Church.

Dating back to 1567 before every session in both the Lords and the Commons, members stand, turn to face the wall behind them, and pray. Attendance is voluntary, but only Christian prayers are ever read out. This is the form of the Common's main prayer, as read aloud by the speaker's chaplain:

Lord, the God of righteousness and truth, grant to our Queen and her government, to Members of Parliament and all in positions of responsibility, the guidance of your Spirit. May they never lead the nation wrongly through love of power, desire to please, or unworthy ideals but laying aside all private interests and prejudices keep in mind their responsibility to seek to improve the condition of all mankind; so may your kingdom come and your name be hallowed. Amen.

Perhaps we can join them in this prayer and in a prayer from the Evangelical Alliance.

God of all peace, bring calm across our nation.

King of all Kings, guide our leaders. Give them courage, wisdom and compassion as they make decisions.

Father of all creation. Help your Church to show love and reconciliation to a divided community.

And as our media is filled daily with the horrors of knife crime can we pray. Heavenly Father. We pray that you would protect our communities from further acts of violence, and fill our streets with peace. For those who are mourning the loss of loved ones, would you draw close to them and bring them comfort. Would those who feel fearful or vulnerable instead be filled with hope. We pray that these recent attacks would not lead to fear, uncertainty, or division. And may they not become a catalyst for further acts of hate. That those in power will find the resources to find distractions for those young people consumed by gang culture. Thank you for the men and women who risk their lives on behalf of others. Would you empower the police and emergency services to protect our communities from further acts of violence. And would you empower us, your church, to be peacemakers in our communities. We look forward to the day when weapons will be beaten into ploughshares, every tear will be wiped away, and death will be swallowed up forever. We pray for a foretaste of that day right now. ## Spiritual Desert

Searching the internet for thoughts on judging people I stumbled across this story by Tara Brach.

"Imagine you are walking through the woods and you see a small dog. It looks cute and friendly. You approach and move to pet the dog. Suddenly it snarls and tries to bite you. The dog no longer seems cute and you feel fear and possibly anger. Then, as the wind blows, the leaves on the ground are carried away and you see the dog has one of its legs caught in a trap. Now, you feel compassion for the dog. You know it became aggressive because it is in pain and is suffering."

We are all creatures of our evolution and judgement of people and situations are part of a survival mechanism. But Jesus asks more of us than our base instincts. He asks us to look into others for their pain and suffering and bring them His healing faith.

He looked at me, saw my lack of love for myself, my pain, my suffering, my guilt, my wanderings in a spiritual desert, I was living in. He didn't judge me He offered me love, life eternal and freedom. He died for me on the cross at Easter.
