Weekly Prayer Focus Dereham Baptist Church

Dereham Baptist Church, in Norfolk, is a community of more than 200 people which has been at the heart of Dereham for more than 200 years. The church has two ministers, Nigel Bayley and Dave Ward, and has a proven track record of making a difference to the quality of people's lives in the community.

Outreach – some under the charity umbrella of 'Love Dereham' – covers a CAP Job Club, CAP money courses, community lunches, English classes to other nationalities, plus a weekly coffee shop, monthly meals, a craft club, youth club and toddler group. A toddler group also meets in another venue and this is linked with a 'Little Fishes Sunday' for the parents to attend an informal gathering with a gospel message. There is a Saturday evening service which is held in Portuguese which is attended by 40-50 people and has its own minister, Pastor Marcos Hernandez.

The outreach had to stop abruptly, like everything else, with the government advice a few weeks ago and there was a steep learning curve to get services online and ensuring everyone was connected by email if at all possible — and also linked into small groups with a few designated 'runners' able to do errands. The new Dereham Baptist Church YouTube channel is putting out messages daily, which is greatly helping people to feel strengthened and connected.
