
Virtual Prayer Room

Her mother, Mary, a Stalham resident says Ros is having breathing difficulties, is on a drip and receiving medication. Please pray she is able to quickly recover from her illness and is able to return to nursing, support the <u>Lighthouse Church</u> in Durban and continue to be part of SBC's extended fellowship."

On Tuesday Diana said "Hi all. Appreciate a special prayer. Really bad side effect from my immune boosting injection. Had to ring the cancer unit at 6.00am because of horrendous back pain. Dr agreed for me to stop the injection on this round (I have had 3 of 5) and let it get out of my system. Will review it at my next treatment on the 5th."

Courage Is Not The Absence Of Fear

Roshan Mendis does not describe himself as a brave man. But I think that anyone who has met him would respectfully beg to differ. Writes Hannah Watson of BMS World Mission. His native Sri Lanka was riven by brutal conflict for over 30 years, and he has experienced a closer walk with death and loss than many of us might ever know. In his work, often partnering with BMS World Mission, Roshan has become well-acquainted with trauma. He co -ordinated psychosocial and livelihoods support after the devastating Easter Sunday bombings last year, and now once again he's at the heart of a crisis response as Sri Lanka faces the threat of Coronavirus.
