But she could do with a few more bits and pieces so if you have something boxed up languishing in the back of a cupboard that would raise money for the building fund please leave it at the back of the church at the collection point, or have a chat with Fran about any items you have.

Recent Electrical Works in Stables and Toilets: SBC recently engaged a local electrician to carry out the following works. Installation of 8 convector wall heaters, 30 Spot lights, one heat alarm in the kitchen and two smoke alarms in the remainder of the Stables, one fan unit in ladies toilets, hand wash units in each of the toilets and a new strip light in the kitchen Each individual heater has its' own switch and thermostat. To use the heater press switch and set the thermostat to your required temperature. It takes 3-4 minutes to required heat. The heat alarm in the kitchen will activate if there is a fire and will of course activate the two smoke alarms.
