


Please pray for us as we seek a new pastor to carry on preaching the Gospel to the people of Gorleston.





Praying Together

Timothy Keller in his book "Prayer: Experiencing Awe and Intimacy with God"," observes that knowing the God of the Bible better can't be achieved all by oneself. Writes Jerry Otieno

He says that "it entails the community of the church participation in corporate worship as well as private devotion" (pg 23). Indeed the joy and benefits of prayer aren't limited to our regular personal prayer lives alone. but the joy is doubled when we pray together.

However, many Christians don't attend corporate prayers because the thought of praying aloud is very scary and uncomfortable. It's O.K to have and can tell what most captures our hearts and such feeling because public prayer is a difficult exercise affections. to many and one needs to start slow and give themselves time to grow in it.

When you meet together with six or seven friends, you do not have to pray aloud if you don't want to.

You can sit there, be guiet and you will still be part of the prayer. Then, hopefully, with time as you become confident and comfortable, you can begin to participate more in the group prayer. You can start by praying aloud when you are alone to get used to hearing your voice.

By God's grace, you'll find yourself steadily growing in confidence and having a desire to pray with others. One of the benefits of attending prayer meetings is that it provides an opportunity to learn how to pray.

> As we listen to others praying, we are able to learn more about Jesus. Timothy Keller notes, "By praying with friends, you will be able to hear and see facets of Jesus that you have not yet perceived" (Prayer, 119).

Furthermore, praying together is one single most important way of cultivating unity in the church. By

praying together, we are able to hear others' heart

This enables us to have a deeper and richer unity of the Spirit.

Moreover, there is an added power when we unite together in Christ to join our hearts and make our collective requests to our Father (Matthew 18:19).

I hope reading about the benefits of praying together can inspire you to attend our church prayer meetings. "Let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith "Hebrews 10:22
