Girton Baptist Church. A Baptist church has been at the heart of the village of Girton in north-west Cambridge since 1860. Today it continues to be flanked by new developments, offering more mission opportunities to the small but well equipped church. Revd Nick Lowe has been the Pastor at Girton Baptist Church since September 2015 with the specific remit of developing outreach into these new estates. This is currently expressed in several ways, including monthly services at a local care home, a busy Messy Church, and a growing relationship with the local primary school which has been an answer to a long-held prayer. The village fete and Christmas fair have offered further chances to connect with the community, and the church rejoiced in October after a couple who had recently come to faith in Jesus were baptised with a large number of their family attending to hear their powerful testimonies.

The nature of ministry within a village means that the workers are few and the work can be discouraging, especially when response to the gospel is not great. **However several members meet on Fridays for intercessory prayer and would welcome the prayers of the EBA family in seeking renewal.**
