Messages from Naomi and Flo As Cyclone Berguitta Closes In

16th January Dear Church Family,

As some of you may have heard, there is a hurricane coming our way over the next few days.

We are on pre alert, which means that everyone is stocking up on water, batteries, (for the radio), cooking gas, candles & canned food. I've been told that if water pipes are damaged during the storm, it could take 10-14 days to having running water in the house again, and electricity cuts could last a few days.

Once we are notified by the local council that we are in the second stage of the hurricane, we will have three hours in which to head home from work and stay put.

There is a lot of fear among the locals, people are very concerned as it's predicted to be a particularly intense one, and the eye of the storm will be very close, if not directly over Reunion.

Please do pray for safety, protection and minimum damage. We think also of Mauritius Island which is also experiencing the hurricane as it's not far from Reunion.

I'll send you all an email once the hurricane is over, but we feel blessed knowing that we can find protection under HIS wings. We were also warned about this storm coming by a local pastor who prophesied it's arrival, emphasizing that we need not be afraid. God is good!

17th January Hello!

Just a quick message to say that we've been notified that the hurricane has lessened in strength and it shall hopefully be a category 1 rather than a 3/4 as previously thought!

It will be passing over Reunion tomorrow, we are on orange alert as of this morning, which means all schools are closed but economic activity still functions, and will most likely be on red alert tomorrow (where everyone must stay at home!)

We don't know all the effects that the hurricane has had on Reunion Island, but we can safely say it was a lot less than what was predicted! For us, we only had a couple electricity and internet blow outs that didn't last very long, and there was a leak in the kitchen ceiling. Tonight we are off to church to baptise 20 new believers, and this weekend we have our Bible school, second year, classes. Thanks for all your support! Blessings,
