No one's ever seen or heard anything like this - Never so much as imagined anything quite like it—<u>What</u> God has arranged for those who love him.

¹⁰⁻¹³ The Spirit, not content to flit around on the surface, dives into the depths of God, and brings out what God planned all along. Whoever knows what you're thinking and planning except you yourself? The same with God—except that he not only knows what he's thinking, but he lets *us* in on it. God offers a full report on the gifts of life and salvation that he is giving us. We don't have to rely on the world's guesses and opinions. We didn't learn this by reading books or going to school; we learned it from God, who taught us person-to-person through Jesus, and we're passing it on to you in the same first-hand, personal way. ¹⁴⁻¹⁶ The unspiritual self, just as it is by nature, can't receive the gifts of God's Spirit. There's no capacity for them. They seem like so much silliness. Spirit can be known only by spirit—God's Spirit and our spirits in open communion. Spiritually alive, we have access to everything God's Spirit is doing, and can't be judged by unspiritual critics. Isaiah's question:

"IS THERE ANYONE AROUND WHO KNOWS GOD'S SPIRIT, ANYONE WHO KNOWS WHAT HE IS DOING?" HAS BEEN ANSWERED: CHRIST KNOWS, AND WE HAVE CHRIST'S SPIRIT."

How easy as Christians is it to be side tracked by those who express opinions that resonate with us somehow making sense as there is certain truth in what they say, so we wander off pushing Christ's spirit into the background as we slip into the darkness of the unspiritual world?

How many Christians are there in Afghanistan?

It's very hard to know precisely how many Christians there are in Afghanistan, because they must keep their faith completely secret - but only a small number from a population of about 39 million.

How are Christians persecuted in Afghanistan?

Afghanistan is number one on the Open Doors World Watch List for the first time – persecution has increased since the Taliban took control in August 2021. Even before this year, it was impossible to live openly as a Christian in Afghanistan. Leaving Islam is considered shameful, and Christian converts face dire and violent consequences if their new faith is discovered. Either they have to flee the country or they will be killed. This was true before the Taliban takeover of the country: the situation has become even more dangerous for believers this year. The Taliban will make sure that Islamic rules and customs are implemented and kept. Christian converts do not have any option but to obey them. If a Christian's new faith is discovered, their family, clan or tribe has to save its 'honour' by disowning the believer, or even killing them. This is widely considered to be a just reaction. Alternatively, since leaving Islam is considered a sign of insanity, a Christian who has converted from Islam may be forcibly sectioned in a psychiatric hospital. If a woman converts from Islam to Christianity and her family do not, she is likely to face house arrest, sexual abuse and rape, violence, forced marriage to a Muslim or even an 'honour' killing. There is very little chance of legal justice for any woman, and women in Afghanistan have very little social or financial autonomy. Since the Taliban takeover in 2021 position of women has become even more dangerous, and any progress that has been made in women's freedoms has been swiftly undone. What's life like for Christians in

Afghanistan?

"Everything beautiful is considered 'infidel'," says Sharifullah*. He is a traditional craftsman in Afghanistan whose business came to a standstill when the Taliban invaded. "The Taliban want their ideology reflected everywhere, and so all signs of colour, life and hope have been removed. They've been replaced with Taliban slogans, which are a far cry from hope."

Sharifullah is one of the small number of Christians

in Afghanistan – and he has decided to stay in the country, despite worsening persecution. Like all Christians who live there, he has to shepherd a small group of secret believers whom God has entrusted to

his care. For many years, they have reached out to their community with the gospel and their craft intertwined.

Living out their faith behind a veil of secrecy, Sharifullah and his fellow believers knew that the Taliban could return. Despite the dangers, they continued their secret ministry, training women and men how to make beautiful and colourful crafts in a bid to share the gospel.

"The Taliban are killing our souls and spirits," says Sharifullah. "They are killing the souls of our children by taking all that is beautiful away from them."

But Sharifullah is staying strong. "We will never let that hope be silenced," he adds. "We will make sure the world hears the gospel through every breath we take. And we know you will help us by living the gospel, using your freedom and sharing Jesus. Please continue to stand with us."

Is it getting harder to be a Christian in

Afghanistan?

It was already almost impossible to be a Christian in Afghanistan – and somehow it got even worse. Many Afghans fled the country after the Taliban took over, and there was wide expectation that freedoms in the country would be swiftly curtailed. For Christians, though, there were basically no freedoms to lose: Afghanistan had been number two on the Open Doors World Watch List for several years, and Christian persecution remains extreme in all spheres of public and private life. The risk of discovery has now further increased, since the Taliban now controls every aspect of government. This extends to owning documentation - including paperwork from international troops - that may help identify Christians.

How can I help Christians in Afghanistan? Please keep praying for your brothers and sisters in Afghanistan. Your prayers make an enormous difference to those following Jesus no matter the cost.

Christians in Sudan plead for prayer as Islamist grip tightens in country

In 2021, Sudan was one of the good news stories to emerge from the World Watch List report. Eighteen months on, there are fears that the Islamist grip on the country is tightening. This follows the military coup last October. Please pray that the positive steps made towards religious freedom in the country will be built upon rather than undone.

There are grave concerns over the Islamist direction Sudan seems to be taking following the military's seizure of power more than eight months ago.

The coup took place in October 2021 and occurred following an escalation in hostilities between conservative Islamists who want a military government and those who toppled Omar al-Bashir in April 2019.

The overthrow of al-Bashir resulted in a fragile transitional government, with power shared between the military and civilian leaders. During this time, significant steps were made towards religious freedom, including abolishing the death penalty for leaving Islam. At the time, there were fears these steps would be undone – and latest developments have done little to dampen these concerns.

Questionable figures promoted to key positions

Since the coup, more than 100 civilians have been killed in protests. The military has also turned to the National Congress Party (NCP) of former dictator Omar al-Bashir and its sympathisers to consolidate its grip on power, while failing to follow up on pledges to restore civilian rule.

Furthermore, General Abdel-Fattah Burhan – who led the coup – has allowed hundreds of sacked employees to return to work in the central bank, the judiciary, prosecution service, state broadcaster and government ministries. Hundreds of bank accounts belonging to NCP members have also been unfrozen, and some of its leading members have been released from detention.

Burhan has also started assigning influential government positions to former members of the NCP. According to the BBC, this includes former East Darfur governor, Anas Omar, who is accused of human rights violations, and Muhammad Ali Al-Jizouli, who once supported the so-called Islamic State (IS).

Although al Bashir remains a prisoner of the junta and has been on trial since July 2020 for the coup which first brought him to power in 1989 (because that was what the pro-democracy forces had called for), there are concerns that he might eventually be released.

A call to urgent prayer

The international community is putting pressure on the military to loosen its grip. During a visit to Khartoum earlier this month, Assistant Secretary of State for African Affairs Molly Phee pressed its leaders to restore the civilian-led government, adding that it was crucial for the resumption of economic aid. The US Treasury also imposed sanctions on the Central Reserve Forces (a police unit) for its excessively violent repression of peaceful pro-democracy protests.

"These developments are extremely concerning," explains Jo Newhouse*, Open Doors' spokesperson for work in sub-Saharan Africa. "Sudan's transitional government made great progress towards official recognition of people's human rights, including the right to freedom of religion or belief.

"Although there was yet some way to go in ensuring respect for these rights in society, we are very concerned over the reinstatement and growing influence of Islamist elements in government, and the regression in the respect for human rights this has led to.

"The international community must remain diligent in holding the military junta accountable for their unlawful grabbing of power and for the human rights abuses they have allowed to take place since the coup.

"We call on the international Christian community to remain in prayer for our brothers and sisters in Sudan."

- That international pressure will result in the military softening their rule and returning the country to democratic rule
- That the Holy Spirit will comfort, strengthen and encourage Sundanese Christians who are fearful and anxious
- That God will use this uncertain time to strengthen and grow His church.
