

The operation initially seems successful, a scan showing the organs are functioning. Quite remarkably Mark walked a few steps on Monday and has been sitting in a chair and his sugar levels were spot on.

Mark had a set back on Wednesday when a tube supplying pain medication split and now only has one and is in considerable pain, his blood pressure is very high.

Yesterday was Molly and Tyler's birthday but they are not allow to see daddy yet. Please continue to pray as there is a long way to go before Mark will recover and may well be in Addenbrookes for a month.

Please pray for those with the remarkable skills to save lives in this way, those whose after care is so important and the donor and their family.

# What's Happening at London Road Baptist church Lowestoft

The Church is at the heart of the town. The six-strong ministry team includes minister Rev Neal Smith, youth minister Rev Emily Twigg, as well discipleship pastor Rev Rick Hughes, children and families worker Sarah Evans, community worker Liz Read, and Esther Day, who has recently been appointed Community Town Centre Chaplin.

The church is very committed to seeing people come to faith and be baptised, and so serves the community as a point of first contact. London Road has also just completed another Alpha Course run in conjunction and on the premises of East Coast Recovery, an excellent organisation helping people come clean from perpetual and serious drug addiction.

For adults, the church has a full programme including house groups, Knit and Natter, Lunch Box, Community Café, Ladies Coffee and Chat and Men's Work. The church also runs courses such as Alpha, The Marriage Course and Church refresh residential weekends away. Children and young people's groups include Boys' Brigade and Girls' Brigade, Parents and Toddlers,



Who Let The Dads Out (a Saturday morning group for dads, where newspapers, coffee and bacon sandwiches are available), in addition to both church and community-based after-school clubs. There are also various age groups who meet during the Sunday service.
