Shrubsoles Visit

SBC was blessed on Wednesday of this week with a visit from Bethan and Gareth Shrubsoles our Link Missionaries who work in Chad at the Guinebor II hospital.

The talk was fascinating, we were blessed to be able to listen to them, It helps us understand the blessings we have, the plight of others in the world and the courage of families like the Shrubsoles who take the Word of God into challenging parts of our planet.

Gareth spoke of the resilience of the people of Chad to deal with all the difficulties they endure in the second poorest country in the world. The temperatures are in the 40s and can reach 50 centigrade throughout the summer, in the past Wall Baptise shipping containers have been used as therapy units where the temperature inside would rocket in what is basically a tin box, but Gareth turned a negative to a positive by pointing out that the hot weather killed off the mosquitos.

EBA Prayer Focus 7th August 2022 Hunstanton Baptist Church and United Reformed Church

Hunstanton is a traditional seaside resort on the north-west coast of Norfolk.

The church first gathered at low tide on the beach between 1850-1870 before permission was granted for the chapel to

be built in a prominent location in the town centre. Unusually the church is both a Baptist church and United Reformed church - hence the "union".

The church struggled with covid

and has taken a long while to reopen. Numbers on Sundays have declined since lockdown but are now beginning to recover with over 35 present last week. The church is currently without a minister but is blessed with a number of talented members who regularly lead services, along with occasional visiting speakers.

The congregation is mainly older, reflecting the profile of the town, but everyone is very supportive of the church and there is lots of active prayer support for the work and fellowship. There is a well-attended Friday Fellowship each week as well as regular prayer meetings which are currently held on Zoom. The church is regularly used by various groups such as the Guides and the Town Concert Band.

In recent months there has been a whole new deaconate elected and the new leadership team is on a steep learning curve but already rising to the challenges the church faces. Key amongst these are premises and fabric issues with a lot of work that needs to be addressed.

Jose Luis once tried to migrate because economic prospects were so limited in his Honduras community. But he heard about new farming techniques being used in his village and returned. Now he's prosperous and hiring other people to harvest for him.

Pray that hardworking farmers will become resilient, so they have plenty of food during lean seasons.

COVID-19 has not only had an impact on people's physical health but also their economic situation.

About 97 million more people are living on less than \$1.90 a day because of the pandemic, increasing the global poverty rate from 7.8% to 9.1%. Globally, three to four years of progress toward ending extreme poverty are estimated to have been lost.

World Vision's community-led THRIVE model — Transforming Household Resilience in Vulnerable Environments — addresses underlying causes of vulnerability for farmers, since the journey upward from extreme poverty to one of improved well-being is not without interruptions. Resilient families can withstand or recover quickly from droughts and other emergencies, adapting to a changing environment.
