Are we, as local churches, having an 'IMPACT'?

We may ask the question, 'What about evangelism in our Union?' But are we willing to step out of the boat and become the answer to that question? Source Baptist Times A hopeful response to the recent guery on evangelism and mission. By William Wade

Are we, as local churches, having an 'IMPACT'?

I: Are we intentional in our Christian living in maintaining a witness in the places where we spend most of our time work, friends, family, school, sport, etc.? If we are not intentional about being a witness, then it simply will not automatically translate into our social circles.

M: Are we *meeting* regularly with other people

outside of the church? If not, are we willing to take up a new hobby/sport/pastime in order to do so? Evangelism is best carried out close up, and not from the fortress of a church building.

P: Are we *praying* in a specific manner for those that we are engaging with on a regular basis? Rather than praying generally for 'our town', it's better to pray for 'John, who I go to the gym with and is struggling with a cancer diagnosis' for example.

A: Are we willing to join in an activity with those we are attempting to reach (preferable an activity of their choice)? If they like walking, go walking with them. If they like good coffee, buy them a coffee at their choice of location. If they like board games, join them in one. This helps to further break down barriers to real conversations in a setting that is 'home turf' for them.

C: Are we willing to take them to church? Not just to ask them to go to church, but to come with you, with you picking them up if necessary. This needs a bit of thought, as it's best to choose a service that you know will have the greatest impact on them maybe a testimony service or a special event that you know will have the least amount of cringe factor for a guest.

T: Are we willing to talk about our faith and our own journey with Jesus? Ultimately, the greatest evangelist in this process is you... it's your friend,

your family member, your contact. It would be fantastic if you could get to the stage where you share the good news of Jesus in a way that will be both winsome and gracious.

I wonder how many of us are willing to see an IMPACT on those around us regarding our faith? This means not 'putting it all on those in leadership in our Union', but us – all of us – being intentional about our faith; meeting with the unchurched; praying specifically for those outside of the kingdom; breaking barriers by joining in an activity of their choice; inviting them to an appropriate church service; being courageous enough to talk to them about our own story of following Jesus.


communities for Jesus.

Chinese Christians handed more fines for 'unauthorised' Christian activities

60 years of serving persecuted Christians

A Christian man in China has been fined the equivalent of £17,000 for organising religious training that authorities deemed 'unauthorised'. As more and more Chinese believers experience heavy fines for faith-related activities, please pray that they will stand strong in their faith."Christians [in China] are more likely to be seen as a threat to security than an asset," says Thomas Muller, an Open Doors research analyst. Source **Opendoors** A 41-year-old Christian has been fined the equivalent of £17,000 (150,000 Chinese yuan) for hosting what was described as an unauthorised religious training event. The heavy fine is the latest in a series of punishments being handed out for Christian activity considered 'unauthorised' by the authorities.

The event took place in June, in Dali city in China's

southwestern Yunnan Province. The Yunnan Province Dali Municipal Bureau of Ethnic and Religious Affairs ordered him to pay the 150,000 yuan fine after it reviewed evidence of the gathering, including photos, confiscated documents and a list of attendees.

"Heavy penalties are one of the ways in which the authorities hinder Christian leaders and their activities which are then also used as a warning to others," said an Open Doors field researcher. "We recently learned of another case where someone else who ran Christian training faced a heavy fine from authorities."

What's it like to be a Christian in China?

Believer imprisoned for selling Christian books This is the latest fine in a series of court rulings against Christians. In December 2021, a court in China's Zhejiang province upheld a verdict by another court against a Christian online bookseller in experience, Christians are more likely to be seen as a which he was sentenced to seven years in prison and a fine of 200,000 yuan (approximately £23,000). Chen Yu was arrested in and charged with 'selling illegal overseas religious publications online' for importing and selling books from Taiwan. The police confiscated more than 800 of the sold books through contacting his customers in China.

In August this year, a pastor of a house church was detained for purchasing Christian literature online and faces charges of fraud.

And another believer, Chen Lijun, has been held at the Lu'an County Detention Centre in western Anhui province since 13 August while more than 100 members of his church also face persecution, as reported by ChinaAid. Lijun also received a fine of 100,000 yuan (approx. US\$ 13,600) because of his faith, said his



Christians encouraged to 'focus on sovereignty of God'

The outcomes of last month's 20th Congress of China's Communist Party do not bode well for the future of Christians and other minority groups in the country, says Thomas Muller, persecution analyst with Open Doors World Watch Research.

"The Party Congress showed that authorities want to increase their push for control and, judging from threat to security than an asset."

As for the Christians themselves, their response varies depending on the location and the church leaders. The Open Doors field researcher explains: "Some pastors are afraid of the potential of persecution that is coming, while others encourage their congregation to focus on the sovereignty of God and not to worry on the outcome of the event." Our brothers and sisters in China really value your prayers – they can see the power of God at work through them. Please keep praying for them to stand strong in the face of this rising opposition.
