Thaxted Baptist Church

Thaxted is a town in north-west Essex, with several claims to fame, including a blue plague to honour Gustav Holst – the British composer of The Planets – who lived in The Manse in the High Street. Also, Dick Turpin, in his pre-Highwayman days, is reputed to have had a butcher's shop in the town.

> Thaxted Baptist Church, in Park Street, occupies a Georgian building dating from 1832 and the new Fabric team is exploring ways to make the church building more attractive to outsiders. Although currently small numerically, the people have a deep love of God and people along with a vision for growth. Outsiders comment on how loved and welcome they are made to feel.

One of the church's current leadership team, Jim Ford, is in the process of National Recognition and is acting as their minister, and with the dedication of the members and congregation, there is regular contact with the community, in addition to the church's services. A wonderful example of this is the church's provision for people who have been bereaved. There is an opportunity to meet with others and to share support and experiences at a monthly coffee and cake morning. The church also shows its support for the residents of Thaxted's old people's home, where they lead a monthly Songs Of Praise service.

Other activities also include a monthly men's breakfast, which features a short talk followed by a Q&A session, a weekly coffee morning which attracts a number of regular outsiders and the provision of quarterly craft mornings to the pupils of the local primary school. The School is looking to deepen its relationship with the

Jerry's Quotes of the Week

The following quotes are from Timothy Keller's book, *Prayer: Experiencing Awe and Intimacy with God.* (Rev Timothy James Keller (September 23, 1950 – May 19, 2023) "To fail to pray, then, is not to merely break some religious rule—it is a failure to treat God as God. It is a sin against his glory. "Far be it from me," said the prophet Samuel to his people, "that I should sin against the Lord by failing to pray for you" (1 Sam 12:23)"

"Prayer brings you into God's presence, where our shortcomings are exposed. Then the new awareness of insufficiency drives us to seek God even more intensely for forgiveness and help."

"If the Father always hears the Son, then he always hears those who, in Christ, are his sons."

"To lose our grip on the costliness of forgiveness will result in a superficial, perfunctory confession that does not lead to any real change of heart. There will be no life change. To lose our grip on the freeness of forgiveness, however, will lead to continued guilt, shame, and self-loathing. There will be no relief. Only when we see both the freeness and the cost of forgiveness will we get relief from the guilt as well as liberation from the power of sin in our lives."

"We know God will answer us when we call because one terrible day he did not answer Jesus when he called. . . . Jesus' prayers were given the rejection that we sinners merit so that our prayers could have the reception that he merits."
