Bible Reading Blog Romans 12: 1-8 Place Your Life Before God (MSG)

12 ¹⁻² So here's what I want you to do, God helping you: Take your everyday, ordinary life—your sleeping, eating, going-to-work, and walking-around life—and place it before God as an offering. Embracing what God does for you is the best thing you can do for him. Don't become so well-adjusted to your culture that you fit into it without even thinking. Instead, fix your attention on God. You'll be changed from the inside out. Readily recognize what he wants from you, and quickly respond to it. Unlike the culture around you, always dragging you down to its level of immaturity, God brings the best out of you, develops well-formed maturity in you.

³ I'm speaking to you out of deep gratitude for all that God has given me, and especially as I have responsibilities in relation to you. Living then, as every one of you does, in pure grace, it's important that you not misinterpret yourselves as people who are bringing this goodness to God. No, God brings it all to you. The only accurate way to understand ourselves is by what God is and by what he does for us, not by what we are and what we do for him.

⁴⁻⁶ In this way we are like the various parts of a human body. Each part gets its meaning from the body as a whole, not the other way around. The body we're talking about is Christ's body of chosen people. Each of us finds our meaning and function as a part of his body. But as a chopped-off finger or cut-off toe we wouldn't amount to much, would we? So since we find ourselves fashioned into all these excellently formed and marvellously functioning parts in Christ's

6-8 If you preach, just preach God's Message, nothing else; if you help, just help, don't take over; if you teach, stick to your teaching; if you give encouraging guidance, be careful that you don't get bossy; if you're put in charge, don't manipulate; if you're called to give aid to people in distress, keep your eyes open and be quick to respond; if you work with the disadvantaged, don't let yourself get irritated with them or depressed by them. EBA Weekly Prayer Focus 19th November Quay Church Woodbridge

Woodbridge is a vibrant market town on the banks of the River Deben in Suffolk and home to Quay Church based in refurbished buildings in the town centre. The lead pastor is Doug Waller and Guy Mansell is the families pastor at this lively and growing church supported by a strong

leadership team and a wide range of talented volunteers. The church is doing well and is full on Sundays. There is a morning service with children's and youth activities, an evening youth club each week, plus monthly songs of praise service.

Quay has a real family feel and an energetic programme of activities for youth, children and parents. Partnering with families and intentionally supporting parenting for faith is key to this.

With an expanding church community they are looking to take on more staff, plant further congregations, and also explore a potential additional building to provide a community hub that can offer extra space, more activities and counselling services.

There have been a number of recent baptisms, a youth weekend away, and a new Alpha course which begins in the new year and is the first since covid.

The congregation at Quay is drawn from the local area but there is current consideration being given to exploring church planting in surrounding areas.

These are very exciting times for Quay looking at the next steps forward and they ask for prayers to know guidance to develop the work, to strengthen the fellowship, and to bring new people to know Jesus.
