EBA Weekly Prayer Focus 4th February Billericay Baptist Church

Billericay Baptist Church are a family-friendly, welcoming church celebrating their diamond anniversary this year! They are a congregation of around 250 adults and 70 children and youth who meet in two locations in Billericay. Both locations are part of the same church family, but Thynne Road is a more intimate setting, whilst Perry Street also has children and youth groups.

For 2024 the church are focused on Jesus: The heart of everything. Their Church Pastor, Rev Wayne Dulson says that this means that Jesus is at the heart of everything in the church, but also everything in each of our lives – work, school and home.

Wayne has been at Billericay for a year now, and together with his wife Gemma and two children, he has a passion for seeing people fall in love with Jesus and then to see them keep falling deeper in love with Him. Wayne trained at Cardiff Bible College and has spent

23 years in full-time ministry. This breadth of experience with different churches and styles has made him certain of one thing – God can do anything. He is inspired by Jesus saying that anyone who has faith in Him will do greater things, believing that if God calls us to something we must take risks and step out in faith.

Jesus

The church, alongside Sunday services and youth groups, also has regular weekly online prayer meetings and monthly in-person meetings. This year they want to run Alpha, as well as continuing wellbeing days for schools, and, at the invitation of the school, a wellbeing day just for staff. This is done in partnership with Schools Ministry Billericay. A new initiative is as a partner with Kintsugi Hope which trains churches to run wellbeing groups focused on mental health. One of the church's key focuses is on their local community. Rev Gary Bott is the Community Pastor. He has spent the last year getting to know the local community better and building relations with local community leaders and organisations. The church has realised that the community struggles with loneliness and is praying for ways to draw alongside people.

This is an exciting year for the church; whilst celebrating 60 years, they are looking to the past and seeking stories from some of their current members who were original members of the church! They want to celebrate this time with church family and the wider community. Alongside this, they are looking to the future and are passionate about the prospect of hiring a children and youth Pastor. This Pastor will be part of the leadership team as the children and youth are considered integral to the church's identity.

Billericay Baptist Church wants everyone who is part of the church to be involved in sharing Jesus with those who don't yet know Him. They also have a heart to see people grow in their faith and to keep growing. Their children and youth leaders are passionate about not just giving the children and youth a good time but equipping them to

seek out faith in Jesus themselves and be intentional about growing this faith. They want everyone who joins our service in person or online to experience the Holy Spirit speaking into their lives. Their Discipleship Groups are hungry to grow deeper in their faith.

Throughout this year, they are asking the church and community, 'How would our lives be different if Jesus was truly at the heart of them?' The church's heart is to intentionally remove the things in life and in church life that squeeze Jesus out, so that Jesus takes His rightful place in the heart of our lives. When we do this, we believe we will see Jesus do so much more amongst us. Prayer points. Please join Billericay in praying:

- With thanks for the last 60 years, but also the last year which has seen many changes.
- For the right person to become the new Children and Youth Pastor, and for the transition time when they arrive.
- For blessings on the church administrator who is retiring, and for discernment to know if God has plans for a new role instead of a direct replacement.

 For a more intentional focus on prayer, that the hunger and desire will stay strong and grow stronger.

'Let's advocate for a fair and just criminal justice system'

A summit which sees Christians demand police and criminal justice reform is taking place in April The 'Hope for Justice' Conference on 13 April is organised by the Racial Justice Advocacy Forum (RJAF). It is presented in collaboration with Premier Christian Radio, the National Church Leaders Forum (NCLF), and Bloomsbury Baptist Church, which is hosting the conference.

The event aims 'to amplify the voices of Christians and provide a platform to help shape and influence the future of policing and criminal justice services in the UK,' organisers state.

The 'vexed issue of police and criminal justice reform' is set to be key battleground in 2024, with both a General

Election and the London Mayoral Race looming.
'Following an all-time low in public confidence,
Christians demand a police and criminal justice system that is equitable, just, and accountable to the public it serves,' the organisers continue.

This meeting is your opportunity to share your views and vision for

policing in Britain, as we journey toward the third decade of the 21st century, the organisers continue.

'Your lived experience and insight will significantly contribute to the conference, making it a truly impactful and meaningful event.

'Post-event, we intend to pursue the issues with the Police and British Home Office, with a mandate established from the conference.'

Speakers include Sophie Linden (Deputy Mayor for Policing and Crime); Leroy Logan (Founding member of the Black Police Association, Author); Mina Smallman (Racial Justice Campaigner); Bell Ribeiro-Addy (MP for Streatham); Revd Emmanul King (Spiritual Director of Prison Outreach Network); Andy George (President of the National Black Police Association in the UK) and Dr Eleasah Louis (Theologian).

Dionne Gravesande, Principal Advisor on Ecumenical

Relations and Theology representing the NCLF writes, 'In pursuit of a future where justice knows no bias, instead accountability is the cornerstone of our legal system. 'Together, let's advocate for a fair and just criminal justice



system that stands as a beacon of equality, ensuring that the scales of justice are balanced for all, and accountability resonates with the echoes of public trust.'
Bejoy Pal (Ascension Trust CEO) says, 'A hope for justice binds us all together to work towards a future in which justice flows like a river, righteousness like a

never-failing stream and the journey towards peace unites us.

As we look at our own responsibility, hold power to account and raise the voice of those silenced, let us feed into one mission that brings trust and healing to a broken world!

The Racial Justice Advocacy Forum (RJAF) is an ecumenical network of black and Asian Christians tackling the issues of racial justice in society and Church.
