¹⁹ So one of you will ask me, "If God controls what we do, why does he blame us for our sins?" 20 Don't ask that. You are only human and have no right to question God. A clay jar does not question the one who made it. It does not say, "Why did you make me like this?" 21 The one who makes the jar can make anything he wants. He uses the same clay to make different things. He might make one thing for special purposes and another for daily use. ²² It is the same way with what God has done. He wanted to show his anger and to let people see his power. But he patiently endured those he was angry with—people who were ready to be destroyed. ²³ He waited with patience so that he could make known the riches of his glory to the people he has chosen to receive his mercy. God has already prepared them to share his glory. ²⁴ We are those people, the ones God chose not only from the Jews but also from those who are not Jews.

EBA Weekly Prayer Focus 11th February Social Justice: Deafness

Psalm 47:1 is an amazing Bible verse as it commands us to clap our hands and shout to God with cries of joy. Being deaf it is important to watch movements, to

know where to sing or sit down. The EBA Justice Hub has identified 'Deafness and Church' to be a big issue with an aging population, so it is important to welcome and open up about deafness.

Ben Plant from Framlingham Community Baptist Church is part of the EBA Justice Hub and is working with a deaf Baptist Minister about an area of 'Deafness and Church' that is wide open in Norfolk. Everywhere has some sort of deaf provision, but unfortunately deaf people have to travel to witness a sermon, sign songs of praise and converse with other Christians. And being deaf, can create isolation from church because they want interaction and fellowship. As a Justice Hub they feel it is important to pay particular attention to these areas where there is a gap, or not a lot of provision, and to just see how they

What gaps are there in your church in regards to justice issues? How could you fill that gap? The Justice Hub would encourage you to take a step of faith and just go for it. Listening to God is easy, but doing as He says can be hard, but that is what faith is. Take a step of faith in regards to deaf provision. Ben is always happy to chat and provide advice.
