EBA Weekly Prayer Focus 18th February Blackmore Baptist Church

Blackmore is a very picturesque Essex village a few miles north of Brentwood centred around a village green and duck pond. Blackmore Baptist Church is a long-established church which has been led for the past eleven years by Pastor Max Carter. Since Covid the Sunday congregation has more than doubled in size. Most of the new people travel from outside the immediate area and are

drawn to the Bible-based Gospel preaching and teaching which is led by Pastor Max most weeks. The church has young children and several teens in the congregation. There's a good mix of ages and a variety of nationalities including Spanish, Brazilian, Romanian and Lithuanian - in the congregation. The building was full with over seventy people at the Christmas Carol service. Once a month on Sundays, there is a church lunch after the morning service. This is followed by a time of evangelism with a small team going out into the village to bring the Gospel to the local residents. The Sunday morning services often include 'Science Slots' with a teaching emphasis on Creationism. A sharing time is always included and the prayer time covers requests for

The church has a programme of weekday activities that includes prayer and Bible study, short-mat bowls, monthly flower arranging, and a monthly Saturday Praise and Worship evening meeting.

Behind the chapel there is an older building which provides a resource for the village as a community facility. The building is called 'Pennies' as it was built as the village school in 1830 when children were charged a penny a week for their education! The church also has a garden with several large raised-bed vegetable plots to teach and encourage the congregation to grow their own food.

- That the church will faithfully continue to remain Bible based, faithful in prayer and to share the Gospel to the village.
- For the church and the leadership team as it looks to God's leading, His wisdom and guidance for the future.

Who Do You Think You Are?

Who Do You Think You Are? is a short book written by Ted Doe in 2009 primarily about the history of Baptists in Norfolk. It is most definitely not a stuffy trudge through th history of a denomination, nor is it limited to Baptists with a capital B. Instead, there's a more inclusive approach with plenty of humorous asides, good research, and interesting snippets of information.

The book covers topics such as where Baptists fit into church history, how they practised their faith in church (service formats, Bible translations, music etc), and perhaps more challengingly, how their beliefs impacted their actions not only in the area of personal piety, but social action and justice.

We have a rich heritage which should inspire us to pursue a riskier, more radical outworking of our faith. Our Baptist 'ancestors' paid a high price for freedoms we take for granted such as not being forced to pay a tithe to the parish or be a member of the Church of England to get into public office. They worked to alleviate poverty and inequality by

running financial assistance schemes, blanket and coal clubs, and offered individuals better prospects by providing basic education, training and medical care. They did not stop there but went further by working to deal with some of the root causes. This included encouraging workers to form federations (a form of trade unions) and calling not only for male universal suffrage (a vote for every man, not just the rich or powerful), but votes for women too. They were actively involved in their communities to bring about change.

The book has four brief appendices one of which (B) is particularly interesting as it gives a brief introduction to what Christians believe about the end of this world, the way these beliefs have changed over the centuries, and how, even without realising it, we absorb them and let them affect our view of the world and our role in it. I learnt a lot, despite having studied quite a bit of church history. How many of these can you answer? Why did they get called Ana-Baptists? Why didn't early Baptists sing many hymns? How many of the population went to Sunday School in 1910: 5 out of 6 went, 3 out of 6, 1 out of 6? What is the connection between the EDP and Norfolk Baptists?

What went on at Pleasant Sunday Afternoon Clubs? How did the introduction of mains gas affect Baptist services?

A Message from Christian Aid

Something to read.

There is nothing concealed that will not be disclosed or hidden



that will not be made known. What you have said in the dark will be heard in the daylight, and what you have whispered in the ear in the inner rooms will be proclaimed from the roofs. - Luke 12.2-3 (NIV).

Something to think about

In the context of this chapter, Jesus is speaking in this verse about hypocrisy. We are hypocritical when we hold others to standards that we have no intention of meeting ourselves, or when we proclaim a conviction publicly and fail to live by it at times when we think we can get away with it.

not a stuffy trudge through the It's painful to have our hypocrisy exposed and this verse

might make us feel fearful. We all do things we know we shouldn't and perhaps we feel that we are showing a 'front' to the world that doesn't represent our true selves. But it's important to consider this verse alongside the many other times that scripture speaks to us of God's care for us, God's desire for our good, and the importance of the truth for becoming who we were made to be as disciples: 'the truth will set you free' (John 8.32). We should also note those places where scripture speaks positively of being 'hidden'; these are the times when our hiding is not from God or from the truth, but with God. God is our 'hiding place' (Psalm 32.7) and our 'life is hidden with Christ in God' (Colossians 3.3). When we feel like we want to hide away then, the question is how we choose to do that. Do we hide behind hypocrisy or pretence? Or do we seek out God, who through care and tenderness gives us a place to safely hide without needing the cover of secrecy and lies? If you feel like you need to put on a front because life is too overwhelming to be your true self, try taking that to God - it's not wrong to want the comfort of hiding away sometimes.

So it is that can think of this verse in Luke about secrets and lies uncovered not only in terms of the need to be more honest with others but also the need to be more honest with ourselves before God. If we are honest about what we have got wrong, what we are afraid of, why we feel the need to put on a show for others, we might find ourselves freed to live a fuller and more true existence. To do that we'll need to ask for help from God and from those around us.

Something to do

Have there been times recently when you have not lived up to your principles? Perhaps you have urged others to give up or change something in their lives without doing so yourself? Do you feel like you are pretending, rather than being your true self?

Take these times to God in prayer, knowing that you are loved and forgiven. Talk about this with supportive

friends.

Something to pray

Jesus, I get things wrong. I can't see the way ahead.

I feel like I don't know myself some days.

Help me to step forward confidently Guided by you.

Help me to be truthful to others,

To speak truth to power,

And to be honest with myself.

Help me to confront my wrongdoing.

Release me, free me, to try again to serve you, To love myself and my neighbour as myself.

What to pray...

Pray for peace

Pray for an immediate ceasefire and an end to the violence.

Pray for world leaders with influence in the region to make wise decisions that lead to lasting peace.

Pray that God's peace would fill the hearts and minds of everyone who is suffering as a result of this conflict.

Pray for safety

Pray for all civilians – that God would protect them from harm, particularly the most vulnerable, including children, older people, and people with disabilities.

Pray for humanitarian workers – for protection for those who are working to provide humanitarian assistance and medical supplies.

Pray for safe access to food, water, sanitary items, medical supplies, fuel and electricity.

Pray for people forced to flee their homes - pray for safe places to stay and that they will be able to return home.

Pray for strength

Pray for church leaders - for wisdom and strength to lead people through fear and uncertainty. Pray for bravery as they guide their communities and offer loving support. Pray for Christian communities and faith leaders across the region – for unity, connection and mutual understanding so that they can help bring people together and show kindness.

Pray for humanitarian workers – that God would strengthen their resolve and ability to provide relief and humanitarian assistance.

Pray for hope

Pray for those who are terrified, mourning and suffering in Israel and Gaza. Ask God to save them from despair – for the trauma and violence they've experienced not to overshadow hope.

Pray that people in Gaza and Israel and those in the wider region wouldn't lose hope that peace is possible. 'With God, all things are possible' (Matthew 19:26).

Pray for healing

Pray for people who have been traumatised or injured; ask God to heal their physical and emotional wounds and bring them deep comfort. Pray for hospitals and medical workers who are struggling with limited resources and

overwhelming needs. Ask God to provide all the resources and equipment they need to treat the sick and injured.
