Lord, we watch, the world's multiple conflicts on horror filled news screens or sometimes we hide from them as the innocent, who have no power to change anything, go hungry, their homes left as rubble as they try to escape to safe places that don't always exist. Children, women and men in thousands are killed, others suffer life changing injuries, filmed lying in the war-torn streets and in hospitals that are lacking all we take for granted. Many are tortured, women are forced into sex, and children abducted.

Currently there are 110 armed conflicts in the world. Facts Geneva Academy. Lord, as peace making seems to be in crisis and more leaders are pursuing their ends militarily, we pray Your wisdom will fill those who are working to bring the end of conflicts, that You will break the stony hearts of the warmongers and bring peace to Your world. Lord, we pray for the innocents end of conflict in:

Gaza - Israel: At least 30,717 Palestinians have been killed and 72,156 wounded in Israeli attacks in Gaza since October 7th. It is thought that at least 10,000 children have died. The death toll in Israel from the October 7th Hamas attacks stands at 1,139. Approximately 130 hostages are being held by Hamas many are civilians and from other countries.

Yemen: and the Red Sea: The rising tensions with the Houthis threaten the peace process and International security. Over 150,000 people have been killed in Yemen, it's estimated that more than 227,000 have died as a result of an ongoing famine and lack of healthcare facilities due to the war.

The Sahel five member countries in western and north-central Africa: A deadly new era in the decades-long conflict. With millions displaced people. CLICK Ukraine - Russia: Over 10,000 Ukraine civilians have died in the deadly stalemate with currently no end in sight which may escalate into surrounding countries. Myanmar: The Rohingya genocide is a series of ongoing persecutions and killings of the Muslim Rohingya people by the military. It is estimated the death toll is at least 50,000 since the 2021 military coup, including at least 8,000 civilians. Hait: Gangs and vigilantes thrive with killings of nearly 5000, and guilty of kidnappings and sexual violence, notably against women and young girls.

As we rely on food and financial donations to operate, we are extremely grateful when people choose to support us. So, thank you for thinking of us and enabling us to serve people facing hardship across North Norfolk. In 2022/23 we fed 6816 people, which was an increase of 53% on the previous year. Thanks to the generosity of our donors, we are able to provide clients with everything they need, with 72,741kg of stock coming in, up 34% on the previous year.

Food bank usage has spiralled

Poverty has <u>deepened over the past 14 years</u>, leading to an explosion in <u>food bank</u> usage. From fewer than 100,000 in 2010, the number of emergency food parcels from the Trussell Trust has soared to almost 3m a year. Deep <u>cuts to benefits</u> and rising living costs have outweighed gains from <u>large minimum wage increases</u> for

the lowest-income households. These cuts have reduced the incomes of poorest fifth by just under £3,000 a year, according to the Resolution

Foundation. This laid the ground for a deeper cost of living crisis as inflation soared after the pandemic and Russian war in Ukraine to the highest level in 41 years. Source the Guardian.

EBA Weekly Prayer Focus 17th March Barnwell Baptist Church

Barnwell is located in the north-east of Cambridge and Barnwell Baptist church is based there on a large estate with many social issues. Rev Stuart Wood has been the minister for twenty years and is leading this outward-looking fellowship Jesus through a time of change and opportunity. The congregation of about forty people meet on Sundays at the Howard Road building and there It the Cen are also many weekday activities that take place. Eleven years ago, a Community Association, "Abbey People", was established that continues to develop work in the local community, including running a Food Hub. The Church has an Alpha Supper event planned for the end of April, with an Alpha course starting in May. Midweek small groups will take a break over the summer and will be refreshed and relaunched in September.

The church has seized the initiative with the building of the new Marleigh development of 1,400 new homes close by. A couple of years ago the church took on Catrin Horrex as Minister in Training and have agreed to appoint her as a full-time minister for Marleigh when she graduates from Spurgeon's College this summer. The church has bought a house on the Marleigh estate for Catrin and her family as she develops a new congregation there.

The church has stepped out in faith and has taken on the financial challenge to buy the house and to employ Catrin. And so far, God has provided at every step, and they are certain He will continue!

There are challenges ahead with the development and integration of two congregations as one church and with the new leadership structure. There are also long-term plans to redevelop the Howard Road premises to provide better facilities and more sustainable buildings. These are exciting and changing times for the church at

Barnwell and Marleigh. Pray for:

- The engagement with deeper discipleship and the refreshing of small groups.
- Expanding the fringe of the church and the Alpha Supper event in April and the Alpha Course running in the summer term.
- For Catrin as she completes her training and goes full -time from September.
- For wisdom and guidance for the future for the potential development of the church site.

Churches to champion voter registration

As a General Election approaches, a new initiative has launched that will equip local churches to increase democratic participation through registering people to vote, providing information about the need to have appropriate photo ID, and encouraging people to vote on polling day As Voter Registration Week (4-11 March) begins, the

Baptist Union of Great Britain, Church of Scotland,

Methodist Church and United Reformed Church have been announced as ambassadors for the Voter Registration Champions initiative set up by

Citizens UK.

The Electoral Commission has warned that 8 million eligible voters may not vote at the next General Election because they don't register to vote in time; 4 million eligible voters may not vote because they do not have appropriate Photo ID; and 14 million eligible voters may not vote because they are not motivated to turn out to vote on election day.

This lack of participation is skewed - you are at greater risk of not being able to participate in the democratic

process if you are: young, a non-UK national, rent your home, have moved recently, live in an economicallydisadvantaged community, or are from an ethnic minority. The Voter Registration Champions scheme has been set up Baptist J to engage groups to address this, and encourage democratic participation, in a non-partisan way.

Organisations, employers, universities and community and faith groups can be accredited as Voter Registration Champions, and will be provided with free support and resources to help them enrol voters.

Local churches are encouraged to sign up as Voter Registration Champions, as a way of helping to ensure that everyone has the opportunity to participate and be heard in the democratic process.

The Revd Lynn Green, General Secretary of the Baptist Union of Great Britain, said, 'As a woman, I am acutely aware that in the UK, for every free adult to have the ability to vote is a hard-fought right, and yet sadly millions of UK citizens will miss out on their chance to vote when the general election is called because they are not

'Those who are young, those who live in economicallydisadvantaged communities, and those from ethnic minority backgrounds are statistically at a greater risk of missing out on voting for this very reason – and yet so often it is these marginalised communities, amongst others, that are impacted most acutely by the decisions of those who are elected.

'Christians believe that God has called us to seek the peace and prosperity of the places in which we live, one way we can do that is to listen to prospective parliamentary candidates, pray for them, reflect on their policies, and use our votes. There are many challenges facing our communities and the wider world in which we live, but few of these challenges are inevitable, they are often the consequences of decisions made in places of power.

'I am very pleased that the Baptist Union of Great Britain is now a Voter Registration Ambassador – we will encourage all our churches to become Voter Registration Champions and to do what they can to encourage everyone to register and exercise their right to vote.' The Revd Gill Newton and Kerry Scarlett, President and

Vice-President of the Methodist Conference, said, 'As a



justice-seeking church, we understand acting for justice and transformation as part of our discipleship; of our becoming more Christ-like.

'We know that in our communities, there are people who do not know that, in a democratic process, voting is a way to make their voices heard, and to join in shaping a flourishing society. Or, they may not know how to register to vote. 'That's why the Methodist Church is supporting the Voter Registration Champions initiative, and encouraging local churches to get involved in helping to overcome barriers to people's participation in our political processes. We urge everyone to 'love, pray and vote' this election

year.'

Thomas Hart, Youth President of the Methodist Church, added, 'The Methodist Church is supporting the Voter Registration Champions initiative to encourage as many people to register to vote and to make their democratic voice heard regardless of age, gender, race or belief.

'In so many parts of our world, the right to vote is denied, so as the Youth President, I would particularly encourage our young people to register, and then to exercise their democratic right to vote. Young people have the greatest stake in the future, so our engagement in the democratic process is vital.'

The Revd Dr Tessa Henry-Robinson, Moderator of the General Assembly of the United Reformed Church, reflected that, 'As followers of Christ, engaging with the democratic process reflects our faith in action. When we participate in the electoral process, it is not just about making a choice on a ballot; it is about standing up for our individual and collective values, concerns and aspirations.'

Explaining the decision of the Church of Scotland to support the initiative, Emma Jackson, Convener of the Public Life and Social Justice Group, said, 'In a just and compassionate society, exercising our right to vote in one of key ways in which we can not only participate in democracy, but demonstrate our love for our neighbour as we engage in the issues that affect us all and we seek to hold our leaders to account.

'The Church of Scotland in uniquely placed in communities all around Scotland and is delighted to be working with Citizens UK and others as we help encourage and facilitate voter registration and participation in elections.'

16 April is the deadline for registering to vote for local and mayoral elections that are taking place in many parts of England on 2 May.
