Sewing in Uganda Changing the Lives of Ugandan Women.

70% of the Ugandan population are 25 or under but TWAM sees the



opportunity here to aid in livelihood creation as this generation become the country's economic powerhouse. TWAM works with a number of organisations in Uganda including two longstanding partners, Kira Farm and Mindset Development Organisation. TWAM works with partners who truly make a difference. Kira Farm graduates have a 100% employment record and Mindset has rates on graduation as high as 90% in some sectors.

TWAM would like to share with you just one of many examples of Ugandan women's lives transformed. Let's meet Janet, she learned to sew through Kira Farm, where she received a TWAM sewing machine and an accompanying Haberdashery sewing pack with enough supplies to get her micro-business going until she could finance more for herself. Her sewing machine case still has the TWAM packing tape on! Janet heard through a friend that a girl in a neighbouring village whose husband died had been kicked out of the village with her two children and left with no means of support. Janet took her in and also trained her to sew and together they have grown a business. Their business is thriving and the result is a new building to house their growing business and two families with a sustainable income and a future full of hope and potential.

Great sinners, with a Great Saviour.

John Newton is famous for writing the wonderful hymn "Amazing Grace". Before he started following Jesus he was a slave trader, indeed, the captain of a ship transporting slaves from Africa to America. He became a Christian on March 21st 1748, during a long, stormy voyage back to Britain. He went on to become a minister and served God for many years. Newton, however, never forgot the horrible nature of his sin. At the end of his life, he said to a friend, "My memory is nearly gone; but I remember two things: that I am a great sinner, and that Christ is a great Saviour.' The apostle Paul described himself too as a great sinner: a blasphemer, persecutor and violent man, persecuting God's church and responsible for the deaths of many believers. But right away he adds, "Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am the worst." (1 Timothy 1:13-15.)
