### Open Doors Prayer For Sunday May 13th

Hostility towards Christians, especially in the northern Nigerian Sharia states, is spread by radical Islamic teaching and practice. Believers experience discrimination and exclusion, and violence from militant Islamic groups, resulting in loss of property, land, livelihood, physical injury or death; this is spreading southwards.

Corruption has enfeebled the state and made it ill-equipped to protect Christians. Rivalry between ethnic groups and raids by Fulani herdsmen compound the persecution. Converts face rejection from their Muslim families and pressure to recant. Open Doors partners with the local church to strengthen persecuted believers in Nigeria with training, community development, emergency relief, trauma care and legal assistance. On 14 April 2014, Boko Haram extremists stormed a school in Chibok, northern Nigeria, and abducted over 200 girls. Today, half of those girls remain in captivity. Loving Father, We pray for those who are crying out in grief, those whose loved ones have been killed because of their faith. We pray for those who have lost husbands and fathers, wives and mothers, whose children have been taken. We pray for the victims of terrorist attack, mob violence and unjust execution. Comfort, comfort Your people. Comfort those who remain, for they, also, carry their cross. May they be blessed in their brokenness.

May they discover beauty in the ashes.
May their loss and confusion lead them ever deeper into Your love, so that, even in the pain and heart-ache, they may know Your peace.

The Baptist Times reported on 9<sup>th</sup> May that a record number of emergency food packages were distributed to people in the Trussell Trust network of foodbanks last year, with figures released by the charity showing an increase of 13 per cent compared to the year before. Where Universal Credit – the future of our benefits system – has seen full roll-out, demand for emergency food is rising by 52 percent, the Trussell Trust stated.

The Revd David Hardman, a minister based in Southwark, commented on his recent experiences: 'A new father called at my door. He was struggling; waiting for a delayed Universal Credit payment and doing his best to keep his family going. The foodbank had helped but it became clear that his baby needed nappies and other supplies, he just didn't have the money to pay for them. The church helped by buying what he needed for his baby I also made sure he had money on his travel card so he could keep looking for work and avoid being sanctioned. It is a privilege to be able to help families like these – but we shouldn't need to and certainly not so often.' ### Billy Graham Its Never To Late To Turn To God

I've heard some people say that it's never too late to turn to God and we can turn to Him at any time. But I've heard others say that this isn't true, because if we keep delaying we'll reach the point of no return, and it'll be too late to turn to God. Who is right?

Although it may seem like a contradiction, the Bible tells us that both are actually true if we understand them properly. Let me explain.

On one hand, the Bible makes it clear that God loves us with an everlasting love, and He stands ready to forgive anyone who sincerely turns to Christ in repentance and faith. The Bible says, "He is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance" (2 Peter 3:9). One of the two criminals who was crucified with Jesus turned to Him in faith, and although he was only hours from death, it wasn't too late for him to be saved (see Luke 23:40-43). Nor is it for you.

But the Bible also warns that when we repeatedly turn away from God, we can reach a point of no return. The reason isn't because God won't forgive us, but because our hearts have grown so cold and hardened because of sin. God still calls us but we are too insensitive to hear His voice. The other criminal who was crucified with Jesus scorned Him to the end-a sober warning against a heart that has become calloused (see Luke 23:39).Don't delay coming to Christ. Satan whispers "some other time"but the Bible says, "Now is the time of God's favour, now is the day of salvation" (2 Corinthians 6:2).

Ask Christ to come into your life today—and He will.
