Foreign Office Report Into Christian Persecution The Bishop of Truro's report into the UK Government's response to Christian persecution worldwide was published last week and formally launched on 15 July. Henrietta Blyth, CEO of Open Doors UK and Ireland, was among those who attended the launch, at which speakers included Lord Tarig Ahmad, the Prime Minister's Special Envoy for Freedom of Religion or Belief, and the Bishop of Truro, Bishop Mountstephen. Lord Ahmad pointed out in his speech that the situation has significantly worsened for Christians in some countries in recent years: there were 35,000 Christians in Mosul, Iraq before the so-called Islamic State invaded, and now there are only 40. The Bishop of Truro was keen to emphasise that this persecution was a global phenomenon with multiple causes, "even though there are many who would like to attribute it to one cause alone – and to do that is to seriously underestimate and undervalue the nature of the problem". A welcome step is the dedication of £12 million from the Department for International Development budget to address the problem in key countries. "We can no longer say that this is a sidebar issue for a special interest group," Bishop Mountstephen added. "The time for inaction and indifference is over." We certainly agree. Now that the report has been launched, it's important to maintain the momentum. Open Doors has highlighted three key recommendations that we're asking of the UK Government.

 PURSUE PROGRESS Identify key priority countries
KEEP FOCUSED Make Special Envoy on FoRB a permanent role.
