Afghanistan is amongst the worlds poorest countries, poverty is widespread in rural and urban areas. However, estimates show poverty in Afghanistan is mainly concentrated in rural areas particularly in East, North East and West Central Afghanistan.

According to the Afghan government, 42 percent of the total population lives below the poverty line. Also, 20 percent of people living just above the poverty line are highly vulnerable to falling into poverty.



They reach people of all ages and abilities. Their service users include babies undergoing diagnosis and their families, children with complex disabilities, young adults with Autism, adults with addiction problems, and older people living with dementia.

Those taking part in their sessions are supported to express themselves, learn new skills and build confidence and social skills. David Meale, had been collecting tools for TWAM since its inception in 1978. TWAM is a Christian charity based in Ipswich that sends Tools with a Mission tools across the world.

Gillian says, "David's work goes on and there

is still a collection point at AG Meale and Sons Farm Shop and Garden Centre, Wayford."

TWAM's mission is to collect unwanted tools, refurbish them, sort them into trade kits and send them across the world for livelihood creation. They send around 20 containers, filled with over 300 tonnes of tools, every year.

They want to support local people supporting their own communities through livelihood creating projects. They say "We believe there is dignity through work and the ability to provide for yourself and your family. We believe entire communities can be transformed through training and the provision of tool kits and equipment. We believe that God's heart reaches out to the poor and that He calls us to follow His example."
