Virtual Prayer Room

On Thursday 15th August Victoria posted an update on Poppy. Saying "Please pray for Poppy as she has a blood test tomorrow in preparation for her check up next week where they want to stop her treatment for her incurable kidney disease because it is becoming toxic to her body. This treatment has kept her in remission for 1 year 3 months where nothing else we have tried did. Stopping her treatment risks relapse. Please also pray for Poppy because she has been struggling with her hearing for ages. She had a hearing test a month ago and has significant hearing loss in both ears. She has Glue Ear and needs an operation to fit grommets again. The operation requires a general anaesthetic. She can only have the procedure if she is in remission as the risks are too high if she is relapsing, which is why we have held off reducing her treatment further."

On Saturday 17th, Jerry said "Please pray for Alan who has had a chest infection for five weeks. He is on his third course of treatment. Please pray for healing."

The same day Diana posted "Please pray for my friend Attiiq from Pakistan and wife Asma. Their baby is due in two weeks and two days ago the baby stopped moving. An operation would have cost £600. Friends and family prayed and 30 minutes before the surgery was due to take place the baby moved so they didn't need to do the caesarean . Please pray Asma has a normal delivery."

On Thursday prayers were sought for Jenny P who is going to undergo tests and meet a specialist at Addenbrookes on Friday 23rd. Prayers were also asked for Fran who is going to have a CT Scan at N&N on Saturday 24th. Prayers were also offered for June White's daughter Charlotte who is attending Addenbrookes.

Explanation, it can be seen from the above chart that we spent £1016.47 more than we received in income in July, consequently the balance for the year to date is also lower.

We have received a Gift Aid Refund from HMRC for £4738.35 (in August not included in the table above) THANK YOU to all those who give to the church using gift aid.

We have some expenses for jobs which need doing soon.

The top three windows facing the High Street on the Sanctuary need painting as well as the windows and door on the front of the Schoolroom. This requires scaffolding. Between hiring the scaffolding and the painter the cost around £1350. (These have all been renewed in relatively recent years and need maintaining).

In addition, the Church (Sanctuary, Stables and Schoolroom) buildings and the Manse need a Fixed Circuit Electrical test (£958.80) to ensure the safety of all those who work in and use the premises (test required every 5 years).

This is just to keep you informed of our finances.

We would like to say a very big THANK YOU for all fund raising events that have been staged this year. Pat and Allen'sbbq raised £250.00 in July. A BIG THANK YOU to Pat & Allen for all their hard work in laying on the bbq and all who supported the event. Also a thank you to Rosina for raising £160 last Sunday.

Quote of the Week

"I was silently reciting to myself the 23rd Psalm, 'The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want . . .' The man with the tinted spectacles and the man from

the police department were looking at me thoughtfully. They mistook my silence as a sign of weakening. I knew I had to show courage. In fact, I felt much better for having recited the words of the psalm. I had not been so free of fear the whole evening as I was in that moment standing beside the black jeep, a symbol of repression. I lifted my head and said in a loud and firm voice, 'I'm not guilty! I have nothing to confess."

Nien Cheng, Life and Death in Shanghai

In August 1966 a group of Red Guards ransacked the home of Nien Cheng. Her background made her an obvious target for the Cultural Revolution: educated in London, the widow of an official of Chiang Kai-Shek's regime, and an employee of Shell Oil. When she refused to confess that any of this made her an enemy of the state, she was placed in solitary confinement, where she would remain for more than six years. "Life and Death in Shanghai" is the powerful story of Nien Cheng's imprisonment, of the deprivation she endured, of her heroic resistance, and of her quest for justice.
