Freedom Week 2019 -18th-24th October

In October 2018 the Norfolk Modern Slavery Collaboration (NMSC) was



formed with the intention of joining up existing work in the area of modern slavery and raising awareness of this largely hidden problem. Today 19 different agencies including church representatives are committed to working collaboratively through the NMSC to end slavery in Norfolk.

The NMSC are leading a county wide Freedom Week, 18th – 24th October, focusing on issues of

modern slavery. We believe that faith groups have a significant role to play in the fight against modern slavery and we are inviting you to join us for Freedom Week 2019.

On Sunday 20th October we are inviting churches to take part by focusing sermons and praying about modern slavery.

We will end the Norfolk Freedom Week 2019 by hosting 'An Evening to Talk About Modern Slavery in Norfolk', Thursday 24th October, 7 to 9pm at the Sanctuary Coffee Stop, NR1 2QF. Throughout the evening we will have a performance of 'The Face of Freedom' by Ayomide Sotubo, hear from Shayne Tyler (Group Compliance Director of Fresca Group), exploring how we can tackle modern slavery in agriculture, as well as a Q & A session with a panel of representatives working in response to issues of modern slavery.
