Carleton Rode Baptist Church is situated in rural South Norfolk, standing between the villages of Carleton Rode and Bunwell. The nearest town is Attleborough, which is five miles away, whilst Norwich is 17 miles away. The fellowship at Carleton Rode have been described as a "shining light in rural Norfolk". Drawing its congregation from the surrounding area, Carleton Rode Baptist Church meets twice on a Sunday for worship and during the week for Bible Study, prayer and fellowship. Although the church is currently in interregnum, it is supported by its Moderator, Neil Walker, and the fellowship are grateful for his help and support. Whilst the building may be Grade II listed, the fellowship has a real vision for using its location to share God's love with the rural community. The coffee shop, staffed by volunteers, has become the extended arm of the church and welcomes visitors from the area throughout the three days it is open. The popular monthly community meal has been a real blessing to the local community. The Loft Youth Group provides activities for children and young people twice monthly. The fellowship at Carleton Rode have seen God's blessing recently as they had to undertake major building work.
