Empanda Christmas Food Collection

Janet Nicholson is collecting food and gifts for the young homeless people at Empanda in Stalham. Last year the young people were incredibly grateful for SBC's help. The donations were shared by the boys in Stalham and a girl's hostel in Sheringham. The manager at Tesco's in Stalham, Stuart, is again donating as he did very generously last year. Empanda in Stalham has support staff available 24 hours a day. Young people moving in go through a selection process which involves looking at what help they need to live independently and whether or not they are a risk to other people in the Project, with each case being looked at individually and there are no blanket restrictions. Young people moving into the building must be able to work towards independent living and be committed to getting back into education, training, employment or volunteering when they're ready to do so. SBC Christmas celebrations start with the Candlelight service tonight beginning at 6pm. This is a very traditional carol service with all those muchloved carols. The music will be played by the SBC musicians that include guitars, bass, organ, drums and violin and will feature solos by some of the younger members of SBC and carols by the church singers. This atmospheric service in the candlelight, Christmas decorated Church, captures, rekindles and creates memories old and new.

Christmas Carols at the Swan Inn

Tomorrow at the Swan Inn High Street Stalham at 7pm. Carol singing was banned by Oliver Cromwell in 1647 along with Christmas celebrations, leading to pro-Christmas riots in many cities, including Norwich. In Victorian times carols were sung in pubs and it wasn't until the 1880's that they were first sung in churches. Last year the Swan was packed with local people enjoying traditional carols in a traditional setting. Pat was playing the electronic organ and Simone played the violin or fiddle which would have been the instrument used in Victorian times.
