**Open Door:** Thank you for your prayers and support for displaced families in Iraq. Here is a story of one of the many believers who have found hope and dignity again through vocational training courses provided by Open Doors partners, thanks to your support.

Ghazan the Baker Father-of-three Ghazan was forced out of his house on the Nineveh plains in 2014 by the so-called Islamic State (IS). "Back in my own town I used to have a successful transportation company," he shares. "We had a good life until IS came and forced us out." Ghazan arrived in Erbil, capital of Kurdistan, empty handed. "The first 15 days were really hard," he recalls. "I couldn't find a job, I had no income, and the rent for our apartment was high." So when the church offered him a managerial position at a bakery established by Open Doors partners, he took the job immediately.



"Although I don't earn much here and I have to work much longer hours, at least I can pay my rent so my family doesn't have to live in a camp." He says he has learned patience from his situation. "I am a Christian and Jesus teaches us how to be patient. In this situation there is no other road than to be patient. I have lost everything, but I thank God that my family is still with me."
